For the judgment following one trespass brought condemnation, but the free gift following many trespasses brought justification. 17For if, because of one man's trespass, death reigned through that one man, much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ.

<sup>18</sup>Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men. <sup>19</sup>For as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous.



# GOD SANCTIFIES US BY HIS GRACE

# The Holy God declares we have profaned his name, we have defiled his holiness with our sin

Thus says the Lord GOD: It is not for your sake, O house of Israel, that I am about to act, but for the sake of my holy name, which you have profaned among the nations to which you came. A full prayer of confession acknowledges that our sin is more than an isolated example of bad judgment; it is a way of life. Sin is our response to God-fleeing from him and running to other things. We confess that we are sinful people, and we live in need of a Savior.

This morning we use King David's cry for mercy in Psalm 51 as our cry for mercy.

For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross. And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him.

# GOD SPEAKS WITH US BY HIS GRACE

<sup>1</sup>Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the LORD God had made.



During this time we live in faith, trusting in the power of his grace, placing our lives and our church in his hands.


