
GOD SUMMONS US BY HIS GRACE

GOD SANCTIFIES US BY HIS GRACE

God calls us to return to him and give up trying to save ourselves

Return, O Israel, to the LORD your God, for you have stumbled because of your iniquity. Assyria shall not save us; we will not ride on horses; and we will say no more, 'Our God,' to the work of our hands. In you the orphan finds mercy."

We repent and turn back to God

We use this time in God's presence to confess our sins and our need for God's grace, silently, personally before him alone. We invite you to join us in sorrow over your sin and joy in his grace and mercy in Jesus Christ.

God declares that he has blotted out our sins by the death of Jesus Christ

In him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and you have been filled in him, who is the head of all rule and authority... This he set aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him.

¹Now Peter and John were going up to the temple at the hour of prayer, the ninth hour. ²And a man lame from birth was being carried, whom they laid daily at the gate of the temple that is called the Beautiful Gate to ask alms of those entering the temple. ³Seeing Peter and John about to go into the temple, he asked to receive alms. ⁴And Peter directed his gaze at him, as did John, and said, "Look at us." ⁵And he fixed his attention on them, expecting to receive something from them. ⁶But Peter said, "I have no silver and gold, but what I do have I give to you. 

We celebrate the Lord's Supper, resting in the work of Christ that restores and redeems us


