GOD SANCTIFIES US BY HIS GRACE


The great and holy God calls us to admit our sin, to sorrow over our failings, and to draw near to the throne of grace



GOD SPEAKS WITH US BY HIS GRACE

If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ and so we follow his example.
