Leader: For he draws up the drops of water; they distill his mist in rain, which the


skies pour down and drop on mankind abundantly. Can anyone understand

People: Behold, he scatters his lightning about him and covers the roots of the sea.


Leader: For by these he judges peoples; he gives food in abundance. He covers his

GOD STRENGTHENS US BY HIS GRACE

We celebrate the Lord's Supper, living as the children of God through the death of Jesus Christ

We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized followers of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup, you proclaim that you are in covenant relationship with God, that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ and so we follow his example.

We live in relationship to God, giving our tithes and offerings to him in acknowledgement of his glory and resting in his grace

Leader: What commitment is required to live in covenant relationship with God?

People: Living in covenant relationship with God requires us to have no other gods before him. This requires us to know and acknowledge God to be the only true God, and our God; to worship and glorify him accordingly; to trust in him alone; with humility and patience submit to him; expect all good things from him only; and to love, fear, and glorify him with our whole heart.

Leader: What do we reject by this commitment?

People: We reject the denying, or not worshipping and glorifying, the true God as God, and our God; and the giving of that worship and glory to any other, which is due to him alone.

People: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name.

We draw near to you with confidence, coming through Christ as beloved children to a father able and willing to work in us. We rejoice in the wonder of who you are revealed in your name: the almighty and eternal God who is our righteousness, our shepherd, our provider, and so much more. We pray that your glory would shine forth in this world for all to see, even through the poor instruments of our lives.

People: Let your kingdom come.

Elder: May your saving reign be seen ever more clearly in this world as your church hungers and thirsts for your righteousness. Grow your church, the visible people of your kingdom, by drawing more to come and confess that you are King. We long for the day when faith shall be sight, and the kingdom of glory will burst forth, so we pray with the apostle John, come, Lord Jesus!

People: Let your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Father, your will reveals your glory, so we pray that you would rule us by your Word and Spirit. Strengthen us to do your will, to live out your love in our community. Break down the barriers we put up to seek our desires instead of yours. Reshape us by your grace until we truly live for you in all things, as the angels do in heaven.

People: Give us this day our daily bread. Elder: We look to you to provide for a

We look to you to provide for all our physical needs, that we would know you as the only source of everything good. Teach us that neither our work and worry, nor your gifts, can do us any good without you. Grant us to look to you in all things.

People: Forgive us our debts, as we have forgiven our debtors.

Elder: We rejoice in the cleansing power of Christ's blood for our sins. Cause us to rest in his work alone, giving up our labors and efforts and showing his death and resurrection in our forgiving others.

People: And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Elder: Father, we rest in your promise that nothing can separate us from your love in Christ Jesus our Lord. Guide and direct our steps that we may live for you

People: For yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever.
