Covenant indeed shapes the biblical story from cover to cover. The biblical drama displays the fundamental, unfolding continuity of personal relationship. We may view covenant history not as a series of disconnected installments but as a single line. Each new covenant presupposes and renews what went before. Specifically, God's redemptive acts do not oppose or deny his creative intent, but come as restorative promises in relation to creation.

GOD SANCTIFIES US BY HIS GRACE

God proclaims what he requires of us and our ability to meet his requirements

And now, Israel, what does the LORD your God require of you, but to fear the LORD your God, to walk in all his ways, to love him, to serve the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and to keep the commandments and statutes of the LORD...? Behold, to the LORD your God belong heaven and the heaven of heavens, the earth with all that is in it.

Deuteronomy 10

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us

1 John 1

We confess our sin, admitting that we do not love him, serve him, and keep his commandments

We use this time in God's presence to confess our sins and our need for God's grace, silently, personally before him alone. We invite you to join us in sorrow over your sin and joy in his grace and mercy in Jesus Christ.

When we hear what God requires of us we are faced with the fact that we have not done and can not do what he requires. So for our worship to be honest it must acknowledge our failure. This leaves us no other hope but his grace and mercy.

God declares that it is by his grace and mercy that our sin is forgiven

God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast.

Ephesians 2

But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior. 
May I Present to You...

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GOD STRENGTHENS US BY HIS GRACE

We celebrate the Lord's Supper, eating the covenant meal with God's covenant people to be renewed in covenant relationship with him

We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized followers of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup, you proclaim that you are in covenant relationship with God, that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ and so we follow his example.

"To See the King of Heaven Fall"

We live in covenant relationship with God as we give our tithes and our offerings to God, proclaiming our Maker and our King

There is only one living and true God, who is infinite in being and perfection... God has all life, glory, goodness, and blessedness in and of himself. He alone is all-sufficient, in and to himself, not standing in need of any creatures which he has made, nor deriving any glory from them, but rather manifesting his own glory in, by, to, and on them. He alone is the fountain of all being, of whom, through whom, and to whom are all things. He has absolute sovereignty over them, to do by them, for them, or upon them whatever he pleases. In his sight all things are open and manifest; his knowledge is infinite, infallible, and independent of his creatures; so that nothing to him is contingent or uncertain. He is most holy in all his counsels, in all his works, and in all his commands. To him is due from angels and men, and every other creature, whatever worship, service, or obedience he is pleased to require of them.

Westminster Confession of Faith 2.1-2

The Westminster Confession of Faith was written in England in the 1640s. It is both disciplined theologically and deeply pastoral. As part of our doctrinal standards it expresses what we believe Scripture teaches, framing it for the needs of the people of God. We use these words to join us with the church around the world and through the ages.

We live in covenant relationship with our Creator, coming to him in prayer

During this time we live in faith, trusting in the power of his grace, placing our lives and our church in his hands.

We ask that he would work in us and through us for his glory.

God is good! He is caring for his church and making it possible for us to follow his call and love each other and our community. Our bills are paid and we are saving for the large occasional expenses that come our way (annual insurance premiums, etc.).

Your elders are concerned though. This has only happened through God raising up churches and individuals outside of Free Grace to partner with us to see his work go forth in Lewiston/Auburn. As you can see in the graph to the right, giving from Free Grace members is about \$8500 less than our expenses (that's about \$2800/month).

Your elders are praying that God would change that, that he would work so that we cover all our costs and can turn all our partners support to expanding our work making his kingdom visible here in L/A. Would you join us in prayer for this?
