skies pour down and drop on mankind abundantly. Can anyone understand


the spreading of the clouds, the thunderings of his pavilion?

GOD SANCTIFIES US BY HIS GRACE

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

We confess our sins that he would forgive us according to his promise

We use this time in God's presence to confess our sins and our need for God's grace, silently, personally before him alone. We invite you to join us in sorrow over your sin and joy in his grace and mercy in Jesus Christ.

The Bible says that all people are sinners, fleeing from God, but in Jesus Christ we find peace and healing. In his death on the cross. he took our sin and paid the price for it. And so we come to him in faith, confessing our sin and need for him, trusting in his death alone to bring us life.

God declares his love to us, giving us life in Jesus Christ

As one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men. For as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous... where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through righteousness leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord...For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ lesus our Lord.

GOD SPEAKS WITH US BY HIS GRACE

Habakkuk 1:12-2:20

¹²Are you not from everlasting, O LORD my God, my Holy One? We shall not die.

O LORD, you have ordained them as a judgment, and you, O Rock, have established them for reproof.

¹³You who are of purer eyes than to see evil and cannot look at wrong,

why do you idly look at traitors and remain silent when the wicked swallows up the man more righteous than he?

¹⁴You make mankind like the fish of the sea, like crawling things that have no ruler.

¹⁵He brings all of them up with a hook; he drags them out with his net;



"Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word."


We run to the Lord with our questions, taking our stand to wait on his answer
