People: For great is his steadfast love toward us, and the faithfulness of the LORD



# GOD SANCTIFIES US BY HIS GRACE

### God proclaims our sin and calls us to come to him

"You did not call upon me, O Jacob; but you have been weary of me, O Israel! You have not brought me your sheep for burnt offerings, or honored me with your sacrifices... You have not bought me sweet cane with money, or satisfied me with the fat of your sacrifices. But you have burdened me with your sins; you have wearied me with your iniquities."

### We confess that our sin is more than we can manage

Heavenly Father, gracious God, our sins are too heavy to carry, too real to hide, and too deep to undo.

Forgive what our lips tremble to name

and what our hearts can no longer bear.

Trouble us with the greatness of your call

And with our slowness to obey.

Trouble us with the greatness of your steadfast love, O God;

And with the loss of our first love, our fervent love for you.

Trouble us with the struggles of your church;

and grant us faith in the midst of our struggles.

We thank you that you have set us free from a past that we can not change; and given us a future in which we are changed, transformed by your Holy Spirit.

Grant we, who have fled to you for refuge,

strong encouragement to hold fast to the hope set before us,

that we would stake our whole eternity on a life we have not lived and a death we did not die.

We ask this by the power of his work on our behalf. Amen.

Often, Christians act as if they no longer sin. The reality Scripture teaches is that those in Christ are free from slavery to sin. We no longer face death as the price of our sin because Jesus Christ took our sin on himself. And yet, we continue to sin. So we confess our failings and ask that we would live in the strength of Christ's death and resurrection.

## God declares his grace, what he has given for us: his Son

# GOD STRENGTHENS US BY HIS GRACE

# We celebrate the Lord's Supper, proclaiming that God gave himself wholly for us in the death of Jesus Christ, and giving ourselves wholly to him in response

We celebrate God's free grace to us in Jesus Christ by observing the Lord's Supper each Sunday. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized followers of Jesus Christ under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to one of the elders after the service.

Romans 5-6

For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die—but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned... as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men. For as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous. Now the law came in to increase the trespass, but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through righteousness leading to eternal life through lesus Christ our Lord.


What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? [3] Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. For one who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, to make you obey its passions. Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness.

Why is the Lord's body represented by bread and his blood by wine? To teach us that such power as bread has in nourishing our bodies for the support of the present life, the same is in the body of the Lord for the spiritual nourishment of our souls; and that as by wine the hearts of men are exhilarated, their strength refreshed, and the whole man invigorated, so our souls receive like benefits from the Lord's blood. 


### We cry out in prayer to be his, wholly and completely

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
