GOD SANCTIFIES US BY HIS GRACE

God declares that we fall short of his glory because of our sin

All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

We confess our sin

We use this time in God's presence to confess our sins and our need for God's grace, silently, personally, before him alone. We invite you to join us in sorrow over your sin and joy in his grace and mercy in Jesus Christ.

God promises joy: grace upon grace as we receive peace through Jesus Christ

"Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord."



We join the heavenly host in praising God for the Savior who came by giving our tithes, our offerings, and our faith in him

- Elder: God fulfilled the promise of Christmas, which he had made to the early fathers by the mouth of his holy prophets when he sent his only and eternal Son into the world at the time set by him.
- People: This Son took the "form of a servant" and was made in "human form," truly assuming a real human nature, with all its weaknesses, except for sin; being conceived in the womb of the virgin Mary by the power of the Holy Spirit.
- Elder: And he not only assumed human nature as far as the body is concerned but also a real human soul, in order to be a real human being:
- People: Born of a woman; the seed of David; a shoot from the root of Jesse; the offspring of Judah; from the seed of Abraham; made like his brothers and sisters, yet without sin. In this way Christ is truly our Immanuel—that is: "God with us."
- Elder: He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation, by whom all things were created, and in him all things hold together.
- People: And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross.

We pray for God's work in us to rest in his peace and proclaim his glory in all of life
