GOD SANCTIFIES US BY HIS GRACE

God declares our choosing to identify with the world over him

You adulterous people! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God.

We do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

We confess our sin of rejecting his name for lesser names

We use this time in God's presence to confess our sins and our need for God's grace, silently, personally, before him alone. We invite you to join us in sorrow over your sin and joy in his grace and mercy in Jesus Christ.

To the world, repentance is looking backwards in shame, remorse, and regret at what our sin and failures cost us. For the Christian, repentance is looking forward to the one who took all that as his own and gave us himself instead. To the world repentance is about sorrow; to the Christian it is about joy.

God declares our security which is found in our union with Christ

There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death...For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

1) We do not look at others in the same way (New Eyes):

2) We do not look at ourselves in the same way (New Eyes):



As we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal. 2 Corinthians 4

We respond with tithes, offerings and confess together according to the grace given to each of us:

Heidelberg Catechism Question #1 Leader: What is your only comfort in life and in death?

People: That I am not my own, but belong—body and soul, in life and in death—

to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ.

He has fully paid for all my sins with His precious blood,

and has set me free from the tyranny of the devil.

He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven: in fact, all things must work

together for my salvation.

Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for

him.

The Heidelbera Catechism is a beloved Reformed teaching tool written in 1563 in the city of Heidelberg, Germany, to instruct believers in the essentials of the Christian faith. Structured around the themes of guilt, grace, and gratitude, it combines deep theological truth with warm, pastoral tone.
