



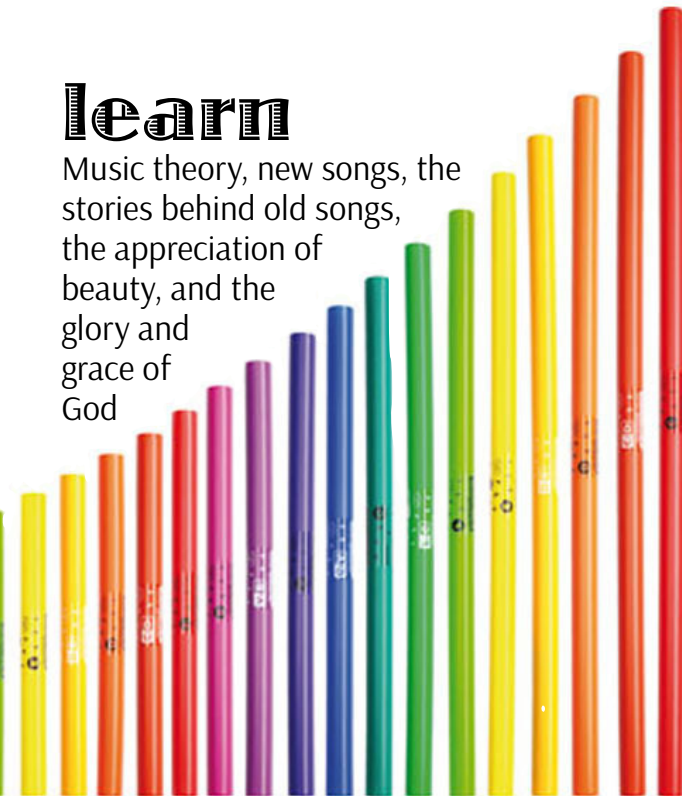

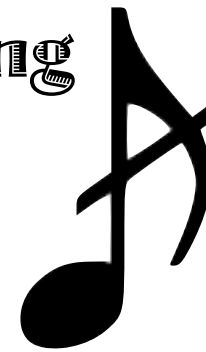
is a unique experience, bringing together traditional folk music and fun innovations like Boomwhacker rhythm instruments and crazy musical games to create a week of fun learning.
